Union College Partnership to Publish AJES

Last March, Consortium President Dan Spada and Dr. Robert Kelly, Chief of Staff at Union College, signed a Memorandum of Understanding providing for a partnership between the two organizations to publish the annual edition of the Adirondack Journal of Environmental Studies. Under the agreement, beginning this fall, Volume 20 of the Journal will be published with a general theme of "Birds of the Adirondacks" with a tribute to the work of Teddy Roosevelt.
