Professor Curt Stager of Paul Smith's College to be Honored with Award

The Adirondack Research Consortium is delighted to announce that Dr. Jay Curtis Stager will be receiving the 2023 Thorndike Adirondack Achievement Award. Stager, an esteemed Paul Smith's College Professor of Natural Sciences, is an author, radio co-host, musician, and an ecologist, paleoclimatologist, and science journalist with a Ph.D. in biology and geology from Duke University. His diverse background and communication skills have enabled him to contribute immensely to the long-term sustainability of the Adirondacks.

The Award will be presented at an Awards Luncheon, on Friday, May 19th, at the Lake Placid Conference Center during the 27th Annual Conference on the Adirondacks. Assemblyman Billy Jones and Dr. Dan Kelting, Interim President of Paul Smith's College, are set to give remarks at the Award Luncheon.
